A history lover's delight! **FORT KNOX** has served as a U.S. Army Military reservation since 1918, and a training center since 1940. The **PATTON MUSEUM** highlights the history of the U. S. Army cavalry and armored forces. Museum exhibits depict the early history of Fort Knox, the development of cavalry and armored weapons, plus equipment and uniforms from the Revolutionary War to the present. A special section at the museum is the **PATTON GALLERY**, featuring memorabilia of the late General George S. Patton, Jr., colorful and controversial World War II general. Before heading towards Louisville, you'll enjoy a brief driving tour of the post including a drive by the **GOLD VAULT**.

The priceless bat used by Babe Ruth is on display and a breathtaking interactive display lets you stand at home plate receiving 90 mile-per-hour fastballs.

Your unforgettable journey through history will begin at the **FRAZIER HISTORICAL ARMS MUSEUM**. The museum holds in trust one of the greatest collections of arms, armor, and related historical artifacts in the world. Included in the collection are: possessions of Henry VIII and Elizabeth I, the ceremonial sword of founding father Josiah Bartlett, the family bible of legendary pioneer Daniel Boone, the "Big Stick" of President Theodore Roosevelt, the bow of great Apache warrior Geronimo, and even the ivory-handled Colt pistols of General George Custer. The collection at the Frazier Historical Arms Museum is brought to life each day through interactive exhibits as well as actors and actresses who portray significant characters from history.
